

Assembly Bills

- AB 988 (Bauer-Kahan) Mental health: 988 crisis hotline.
 - Position: **SUPPORT**
 - The Miles Hall Lifeline Act
 - Coordination of local crisis teams to respond to mental health crises instead of police
 - [Bill Text - AB-988 Mental health: 988 crisis hotline.](#)

- AB 1670 (Bryan) Criminal justice: Commission on Alternatives to Incarceration.
 - Position: **SUPPORT**
 - Creates “Commission on Alternatives to Incarceration”
 - Commission will research: alternatives to incarceration (including youth, incarceration); alternative crisis response models; effects of family separation in jail and prison systems; reentry; restorative justice practices and opportunities

- AB 2020 (Gallagher) Mental health services: gravely disabled.

 - Position: **OPPOSE**
 - Expands definition of “gravely disabled” under the Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) Act

- AB 2089 (Bauer-Kahan) Privacy: mental health applications: mental health application information.
 - Position: **SUPPORT**
 - Addresses collection of personal health information from mental health applications

- AB 2242 (Santiago) Mental health: involuntary commitment.
 - Position: **OPPOSE**
 - Expands use of MHSA to fund involuntary mental health services

- AB 2697 (Aguiar-Curry) Medi-Cal: community health workers and promotores
 - Position: **SUPPORT**
 - Intent to enact legislation establishing standards and requirements, payment and reimbursement, supervision, and scope of eligible services
 - Intent to enact legislation to create advisory structure for community health workers and promotores benefit in the Medi-Cal program
 - Intent to enact legislation to establish processes for “supportive structures” by expanding health care workforce and expanding access to culturally and linguistically competent care
 - Medi-Cal would pay for promotores and community health workers

- AB 2830 (Bloom) The Community Assistance, Recovery, and Empowerment (CARE) Court Program.
 - Position: **OPPOSE**
 - Creates new avenue for individuals living with serious mental health or behavioral health challenges to be referred for court-mandated treatment and services

- SB 1035 (Eggman) Mental health services: assisted outpatient treatment.

 - Enables court to order forced medication in treatment plan
